

Spring 2024 Designation Process

A new index threshold (lowest 5%) will be established in late May after the Assessment team completes their accountability process on the SY22/23 data.

Only ATSI schools will be identified/exited

- Newly identified schools will have Qrt 1 to complete their Needs Assessment and SIP
- Newly identified schools will receive funding for planning and year 1 plan implementation for FY25
- Exiting schools will **NOT** receive 1003(a) SI funding for FY25



Spring 2024 Designation Process

Exit Criteria for ATSI Schools:

"A school may exit after 1 year if all subgroups within the school have an index value above the index value of the lowest 5% of Title I schools."

Due to the late designation, it is encouraged for all schools currently in ATSI status to review, revise, and update their School Improvement Plan for continuous improvement without receiving 1003a SI funding.



Spring 2024 Designation Process

Funding through the SI 1003(a) Grant

Funding received from the School Improvement Grant is determined based on the designations established by July 1, 2024.

Schools currently designated CSI 5%, CSI Grad Rate, or Title 1 CSI-TSI will receive *the same amount for FY25 that they received in FY24.

Schools newly designated as ATSI for FY25 will receive funding for planning (\$10,000 as funds allow) and additional funding (\$25,000 as funds allow) after their plan has been approved.



Scenario: ATSI Subgroup Change

Scenario: A school previously designated as ATSI with a student group of SWD exits that status, but is designated ATSI with a student group of Alaska Native/American Indian. Do they need to complete a new needs assessment and a new plan or can they continue with their previously created 3-year plan?

Answer: The SCLT should critically review their Needs Assessment and Plan to identify what worked to exit the previous student group identification, and what plan adjustments may need to take place for both the exited student group's sustainability and the newly designated student group's needs.



Scenario: ATSI Subgroup Change

Scenario: An ATSI school has exited, but then enters in the next designation cycle. Do they have to re-do the Needs Assessment, or can they fall back on their 3 year plan since it's still within the 3 years?

Answer:

- If the goals of the SIP support the student group the school is redesignated under, then they can move forward with the plan, as it would have been recently reviewed and updated this past year.
- If the goals of the SIP do NOT support the newly designated student group, a Needs Assessment should be done and a new plan should be developed with community and stakeholder input.



Fall 2024 Designation Process

A new index threshold will be established in fall/winter of 2024 after the Assessment team completes their accountability process on the scores and indicators from SY23/24

- ATSI schools will be identified/exited
- CSI 5% schools identified in 2018 or 2019 are eligible to exit
- No additional CSI 5% or CSI Grad will be identified
- CSI-TSI can happen any year (Title 1, 3 year ATSI designation)

Newly identified schools will have Qrt 2 and 3 to complete their Needs Assessment and SIP

*Newly identified schools will receive funds for planning (as available)



Exiting Schools - Expectations



Schools that meet the exit criteria will exit designation status for FY26

- The school no longer meets the lowest 5% entrance criteria (ie, index score does not fall in lowest 5% range)
- The school's accountability index score has improved since the CSI identification year

During **FY25** they will:

- Continue with SIP implementation
- Plan for sustainability sans SI 1003(a) funding for FY26
- Review and reflect on their SIP for continuous school improvement
- Bid a fond farewell to getting to hang out with the SI DEED crew



Scenario: Exit CSI 5% but enter ATSI

Scenario: A school previously designated as CSI 5% exits that status, but is designated ATSI with a student group of Alaska Native/American Indian (or any student group). Do they need to complete a new needs assessment and a new plan?

Answer: The SCLT should critically review their Needs Assessment and Plan to identify what worked to exit CSI 5% designation, and what plan adjustments may need to take place to support the newly designated student group's needs (however, the 5 pilot schools for the Empowerment Process WOULD need to complete a new needs assessment and develop a new plan). Goals need to continue to be in alignment with the Needs Assessment data.

More Rigorous Interventions

Section 1111(d)(3) of the federal law states that CSI schools that fail to respond to comprehensive support within a state-defined period of time (3 years per Alaska's State ESSA plan) shall become subject to "more rigorous State-determined action, such as the implementation of interventions."

More information will be forthcoming on Alaska's MRIs for Fall 2025 designations after review of the Empowerment Process, school and district plans, and the capacity of our small and struggling schools.
