

#### **OVERALL RESULTS**

- In 2024, the average score of fourth-grade students in Alaska was 202. This was lower than the average score of 214 for students in the nation.
- The average score for students in Alaska in 2024 (202) was not significantly different from their average score in 2022 (204) and was lower than their average score in 2003 (212)
- The percentage of students in Alaska who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 22 percent in 2024. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2022 (24 percent) and was smaller than that in 2003 (28 percent).
- The percentage of students in Alaska who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 47 percent in 2024. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2022 (51 percent) and was smaller than that in 2003 (58 percent).

\* Significantly different (p < .05) from the state's results in 2024. Significance tests were performed using unrounded numbers.





## **SCORE GAPS FOR STUDENT GROUPS**

- Data are not reported for Black students in 2024, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2024, Hispanic students had an average score that was not significantly different from that for White students.
- In 2024, male students in Alaska had an average score that was lower than that for female students by 7 points.
- In 2024, students who were identified as economically disadvantaged had an average score that was 25 points lower than that for students who were identified as not economically disadvantaged. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2003 (32 points).



NOTE: The NAEP reading scale ranges from 0 to 500. Results presented in this report are based on public school students only. Statistical comparisons are calculated on the basis of unrounded scale scores or percentages. Score gap results for "Black," "Hispanic," and "White" presented in this report are based on the 6-category race/ethnicity variable with data available starting in early 1990s.
