The bachelor's in elementary education is a hands-on program that prepares you for high demand teaching careers in Alaska and across the country. Numerous fieldwork experiences, including a year-long internship, complement coursework in a wide range of content areas. Our program also integrates resources, knowledge and experiences unique to Alaska—offering unique insights and training specific to the geographic and cultural context of our state.

Certificate/Associate Degree Programs

- At least 18 Years Old, or
- High School Diploma/GED

Bachelor's Degree Program

- High School Diploma/GED and:
 - Pass the 16-credit high school core curriculum with at least a 2.5, and have a cum. GPA of 2.5

If you don't meet these requirements, contact an admissions counselor. You may have options to begin a degree or certificate program, such as starting as a pre-undeclared student or as a non-degree student.

FINANCIAL AID/SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTINITIES

The new University of Alaska Teacher Internship Scholarship offers tuition and living expense support to eligible students in UA's initial teacher licensure programs:

\$10,000 living stipend

- Undergraduate students in their final 2-years (60 credits) of their preparation program are eligibile for tuition support/living stipend during their final full-time internship year
- Graduate students enrolled in an initial licensure program

UNIQUE FEATURES/ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

CREDIT TRANSFERABILITY | All content courses (e.g., math, English, science, etc.) and Education courses taken at other institutions are carefully reviewed by Elementary faculty relative to the BA in Elem. Ed degree requirements. Whenever possible, petitions are prepared and credit awarded for prior coursework.

ADVISING | The School of Education has three advisors who work closely with students to guide students seamlessly through the process of teacher licensure and degree attainment.

TEACHING EXPERIENCE | All secondary faculty members have taught in public schools and hold a teaching certificate. 90% of elementary faculty have taught in Alaska schools.

ACCELERATED PATHWAYS | The Postbaccalaureate Licensure and the M.Ed. in Secondary Education with Licensure programs can be completed within one academic year. Flexible program entry points and personalized timelines are available to accommodate individual needs. The secondary program supports the Alaska Department of Education and Early Development (DEED) pathways, allowing individuals to teach while completing their certification requirements.

STRATEGIES TO SPEED CREDIT ATTAINMENT | Compressed course: 3 credit courses taught in 8 weeks instead of 16. To meet requirements there would need to be 1x3 hour contact sessions per week during the 8 weeks. In collaboration with the school district, a specific day of the week could be identified for classified staff to leave work early to complete their contact time coursework (e.g. every Tuesday from 2:30-5:30pm). Course intensive: 3 credit courses, typically offered right after the school contract year ends or right before it begins that meets for 5-6 consecutive days for approximately 5-6 hours a day, and also has associated coursework and contact time prior to the week, and after the week equal to ~12 hours of contact time.

SPECIAL OPTIONS | Enrollment in the secondary program qualifies for the Alaska Department of Education and Early Development (DEED) pathway for teacher licensure while working, enabling postbaccalaureate students hired by a school district to obtain licensure through current program enrollment.

SCIENCE OF READING COURSES | Both elementary teacher licensure programs include School of Education DEED approved courses that fulfill the Alaska Reads Act Teacher endorsement requirement. Graduates receive the DEED Reads Act Endorsement on their teaching certificate.

DISTRICT PARTNERSHIPS | SOE has forged significant and long term partnerships with school districts representing all of Alaska's geographic regions. These collaborative efforts have strengthened ties between the university and the communities it serves, ensuring that education in Alaska remains responsive to local needs and priorities. The UAF School of Education partners with school districts across Alaska to offer scholarships, paid teacher placement options, and job opportunities.

SPECIAL EDUCATION FACULTY | UAF School of Education has two highly qualified special education faculty who teach required courses in the BA in Elementary and Secondary, M.Ed. Secondary programs and teach courses for the Special Education minor.
