

## **QUICK GUIDE TO STATEWIDE ASSESSMENTS**

According to Alaska Regulations <u>4 AAC 06.710</u> and <u>4 AAC 06.712</u>, public schools in Alaska must administer the following assessments: a standards-based test, an alternate assessment, the National Assessment of Educational Progress, a kindergarten developmental profile, and an assessment to measure English language proficiency. As part of the Alaska Reads Act, <u>14.30.760 of HB 114</u>, it is described that the department shall adopt a statewide screening tool.
