# Alaska Bible College — Literacy Pathway

# ED-ST4101 – Student Teaching Practicum

Provides guided classroom experience where candidates begin applying literacy instruction and scaffolding strategies under supervision, linking coursework to real-world teaching practice.

## **ED-ST4201 – Student Teaching**

Culminates the literacy pathway as candidates independently plan and deliver reading and language instruction, demonstrating mastery of effective teaching and student-centered literacy practice in an Alaskan classroom setting.

## **Professional Practice**

# ED-IM3101 – Science of Reading

Builds a research-based understanding of how students learn to read, using current models such as the Reading Rope to connect phonemic awareness, phonics, fluency, vocabulary, and comprehension.

## **ED-IM3201 – Language Arts**

Applies the principles learned in the Science of Reading to daily classroom instruction. Candidates design and deliver lessons that integrate reading, writing, speaking, and listening, learning how to build literacy fluency and comprehension across all subject areas.

# **ED-IM3103 – Instructional Scaffolding in Literacy**

Focuses on supporting students who struggle to reach reading proficiency. Candidates learn to apply structured, evidence-based scaffolding strategies that maintain high expectations while providing targeted support to help all learners succeed in literacy.

## **Core Literacy Instruction**

### **GE-1101** – Intro to Teacher Ed

Students complete initial classroom observations, gaining early exposure to reading instruction and literacy practices in local Alaska classrooms.

### **GE-1201 – Child Development**

Examines how children develop language and literacy skills, helping future teachers connect reading growth to stages of cognitive and emotional development.

# **CAEP Accreditation**

#### **Self-Study Development**

Initial drafting and evidence collection for all CAEP standards begins.

#### First Review & Feedback

CAEP review team provides preliminary findings; areas for improvement identified.

## Response & Evidence Submission

ABC submits strengthened documentation addressing review feedback.

#### **Site Visit**

CAEP evaluation team conducts the virtual onsite review of program quality and compliance.

#### **Accreditation Decision**

ABC anticipates full CAEP accreditation at the June commission meeting, aligning with the end of the provisional state approval.

# Student Outcomes & Assessments

## **Praxis Data**

- Freshman pass rate for Praxis I is 50% for first attempt.
- Senior pass rate for Praxis
   II is 100% for first attempt.
- New personalized Praxis I
   Math and English tutoring
   program is in development
   to strengthen early success.

## **Graduate Success**

- Both program completers are currently teaching in Alaska Classrooms.
- Employers report high classroom readiness and strong instructional practice.
- Requests received from partner schools to host future student teachers.

- Department uses multiple data points: course evaluations, grades, and Praxis results.

# **Community Partnerships**

- Collaboration with MSBSD and Birchwood Christian School provides practicum placements and real-world classroom experience.
- Partnerships ensure course content reflects current instructional practices and Alaska's Educational priorities.

- Courses align with the Alaska Reads Act and CAEP expectations for evidencebased instruction.
- The new Instructional Scaffolding in Literacy course equips candidates to meet student learning needs without lowering expectations.

## **Faculty & Program Development**

- Faculty bring experience from both K-12 and higher education, strengthening practical instruction.
- Department reviews each semester promote reflection, collaboration, and steady improvement in program quality.



# Next Steps & Goals

- CAEP Accreditation
  - Finalize documentation and evidence ahead of the January 2026 site visit.
  - Prepare stakeholders and host training interview readiness and site-visit logistics.
- Program Refinement
  - Expand on graduate-level opportunities to expand ABC's impact in Alaska Education.
  - Continue refining course sequencing and assessment alignment to strengthen literacy outcomes.
- Candidate Support
  - Implement the personalized Praxis I tutoring program to raise early pass rates.
  - Provide continued mentorship and professional guidance for graduates at no cost, supporting their success beyond graduation and into their early teaching careers.
- Partnership & Outreach
  - Maintain strong collaboration with MSBSD and Birchwood Christian School for field experiences.
  - Expand field opportunities to rural Alaska.

# Summary

Alaska Bible College's Educator Preparation Program continues to demonstrate steady growth and excellence in preparing future teachers for Alaska's classrooms. Our graduates are entering the profession with strong instructional skills, professional integrity, and a heart for service.
