## FY2025/FY2026 Budget Comparison

Category	FY2025 Management Plan	FY2026 Enacted	Change	% Change
Total Agency Budget	\$1.86 billion	\$1.76 billion	-\$96.5M	-5.2%
Unrestricted General Funds	\$1.47 billion	\$1.39 billion	-\$78.4M	-5.3%
Federal Receipts	\$291.6 million	\$267.1 million	-\$24.6M	-8.4%



### Significant Decreases – FY2025 vs FY2026

### 1. FY2025 Additional Foundation Funding

• \$174.6 supplemental in FY2025 not repeated in FY2026

#### 2. Child Nutrition

\$24.9 end of pandemic-era federal grants

#### 3. Residential Schools

• \$1.5 expiration of a one-time allocation is FY2025

### Significant Increases – FY2025 vs FY2026

#### 1. K-12 Foundation Program

- + \$103.3 million (+8.9%)
- From \$1.167 billion to \$1.270 billion

### 2. Student Financial Aid Programs

- \$4.5 million (+21.4%)
- Alaska Performance Scholarship: +\$3.0M
- Alaska Education Grants: +\$1.5M

### 3. Alaska Student Loan Corporation

• + \$1.06 million (+10.8%)

### **Dept of Education and Early Development**

- 1. Personnel Services 2-5% increase
  - Grants Ending LTNP PCNs not being extended
  - Merit Increases per union contracts
  - FY2026 Approved PCNs 305 ( 280 FT, 13 PT, & 12 Temp)
- 2. Administrative Order #358 Hire and Travel Freeze
  - DEED's vacancy rate will appear higher than is typical.
  - DEED staff travel is primarily allocated for mandatory grant monitoring, in-state.
