Lydia thinks that what makes her uniquely qualified for the vacant seat is because she is a half Yupik, 29-year-old woman, living in Inupiaq country who is raising her 14-year-old brother. She grew up in Nightmute Alaska, a small village of less than 300 residents and has also lived in urban areas like Anchorage.

She has been engaged in her own community and has served as an advocate and a volunteer to serve youth and her community.
