Tongass School of Arts and Sciences- Renewal Application Summary

The Ketchikan Gateway Borough School District approved the Tongass School of Arts and Sciences renewal application on December 9, 2020, for 10 years, through the end of SY 2030-31. Tongass School of Arts and Sciences first opened in 2003 and last renewed for 10 years in 2011.

Program Information:

Tongass School of Arts and Sciences (TSAS) has a PreK-6 enrollment of 170 students, not including preschool. The current staff to student ratio is 1 teacher to 14.2 students. TSAS is located at 410 Schoenbar Rd. Suite 201, Ketchikan, AK 99901. The school shares a district-owned facility, Valley Park Campus, with another charter school. The two charter schools share a gym, parking area, playground, and athletic field. The TSAS portion of the building is 18,796 square feet with five joined classrooms, a multipurpose area, library, detached music room, SpEd support rooms, Sped office and work area, conference room, storage areas, custodial room, school office, and three restrooms. Current expansion plans are to enclose a covered deck for a safe and secure double entrance for the front office. Due to COVID-19, the KGBSD used CARES Act money to rent additional space in a church for the TSAS for the school year to decrease class size. The school had an approved budget of \$2,028,341 for SY 2020-2021.

TSAS budgeted staff include 1 Principal, 1 Secretary, 1 Health/Office Para, 9 classroom teachers, 1 Special Education Teacher, 1 Music, 1 Counselor, .5 PE teacher, 1 Title I teacher, 1 Library Para, 6 Classroom Para, 1 Title I Para, 1 ELL Para, 9 special education Para, 3 Special Education PreK Para, 1 Speech Para, 1 Food Service, and 1 Custodian.

TSAS is a school-wide Title I school. The TSAS program uses Science focused curriculum guided by the Highly Effective Teaching (HET) framework aligned with Standards. Student knowledge and learning is presented through Art. Students are in team-taught multi-grade classes of PreK-K, 1/2,3/4, and 5/6. The school is proud of its joint teacher planning time, use of Conscious Discipline, and the recent inclusion of local indigenous languages. The positive and supportive environment encourages student's educational risks in core content and the equally important Music, Fine Arts, Performing Arts, Physical and Health Education, Cultural Studies, and Social Skills development. TSAS ensures addressing standards through an integrated curriculum focusing on the Sciences and teacher lead exploration of topics directly tied to the Alaska State Standards. The use of various professional development resources support teachers reviewing and correlating curriculum, materials, and report cards to standards. Assessment occurs through state assessments, trimester standards-based report cards, portfolios, student evaluations, student-led conferences, exhibitions, and performances.
