Standing Report



DIVISION OF LIBRARIES, ARCHIVES & MUSEUMS

The Division of Libraries, Archives & Museums (LAM) provides and coordinates library services in Alaska, preserves government records, and collects, cares for, and exhibits the cultural and natural heritage of our state. The Division has five main budget components: Library Operations, Archives, Museum Operations, Online with Libraries, and Andrew P. Kashevaroff Facilities Maintenance. The Division supports approx. 50 fulltime team members who work at the Andrew P. Kashevaroff Building in Juneau and the Sheldon Jackson Museum in Sitka.







SPECIAL EXHIBITS

MUSEUM REACCREDITATION





American Alliance of part of the 10-year Museums

June: LAM hosted two site reviewers as reaccreditation **process** for the Alaska State

Museums with the American Alliance of Museums. Site reviewers met with staff, toured collections, reviewed

policies, conversed with board members, and observed visitor interactions at both the Alaska State Museum in Juneau and Sheldon Jackson Museum in Sitka.

LAM GRANTS



Alaska Public Library Assistance (PLA) Grants: 81 Alaska public libraries were awarded FY26 PLA Grants of \$7,000 each for a total of \$567,000 of support from the Division. These non-competitive grant funds can be used for a variety of operating expenditures including staff, utilities, collection materials, computers, and educational programming.



Museum Grant-in-Aid (GIA) Awards: 10 Alaska museums were awarded FY26 GIA Awards for a total of \$97,871.68 of support from the Division. These competitive grant funds can be used for projects related to collections, exhibits, education, outreach, and organizational development. Funds can be used to purchase supplies and equipment, pay for contractual services and personnel, or other items necessary to support and improve museum services.

EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS AND OUTREACH

June 17-July 3: Sheldon Jackson Museum Artist-in-Residence Liz Chikayaasiâ Morrow (Unangaâ) gave two artist talks and a workshop during her three-week residency. Talks were titled, "Relief Printing as a Reflection of Traditional Indigenous Carving" and "My SJM Experience." The workshop "Intro to Relief Printing" offered participants hands-on experience carving and printing their own linoleum blocks. Morrow also led a community event in which a steamroller rolled over carved linoleum blocks; helped residents at the Sitka Pioneer Home to make bookmark prints; and taught 4-H students how to make relief prints.








July 16-August 1: Sheldon Jackson Museum **Artist-in-Residence Shirley Hootch** (Yup'ik) gave a public talk in-person and online titled "How I Started" sharing how she began making jewelry with ivory, baleen, and wood. Hootch also led a workshop in which participants carved their own pair of mask earrings and spent time with residents at the Sitka Pioneer Home.



July 17: Cruise ship group "Quilt Addicts Anonymous" shared knowledge of historic textiles in the Alaska State Museum conservation lab.



August 9: LAM offered a free film showing of *Storis: The Galloping Ghost of the Alaskan Coast* produced by Film and Media Archivist **Damon Stuebner**. Lively discussion with many stories about the U.S Coast Guard Cutter *Storis* followed the screening. The public event coincided with the arrival and commissioning of the new *Storis* in Juneau.



August 11: The Children's Exploration Center hosted a **Kinder-Ready In-Service Meeting** for 9 teachers from Mendenhall River Community School and Harborview. The CEC team shared lesson plans that combine collection resources and math concepts to support Alaska State Standards.



August 29: Sheldon Jackson Museum Artist-in-Residence Sydney Akagi, Tleinax Shaawat (Tlingit and Haida) gave a public talk "Threads of Resurgence: Chilkat Weaving, Repatriation, and the Power of Indigenous Female Art in Alaska" at the Sheldon Jackson Museum and via Zoom.

COLLECTIONS MANAGEMENT



State of Alaska Recorders Volumes: The Department of Natural Resources contracted with US Imaging to digitize thousands of Recorders Volumes held in the collections of the Alaska State Archives. Contracted staff arrived in July, set up equipment in the paper lab, and processed volumes with the assistance of Archives team members.
