 Family/Community Engagement: Throughout the school year, a variety of meaningful opportunities were offered to engage families and the broader community in support of literacy. Three parent literacy education trainings—held in October, January, and March—provided families with practical tools and strategies rooted in the Science of Reading to help support their children's learning at home.
