

The Alaska Reads Act



Eligibility for Early Education Program Approval and 0.5 ADM Funding

The Alaska Reads Act (House Bill 114, Chapter 40, SLA 2022) provides school districts with the opportunity to build and grow early education programs for 4- and 5-year-old students by providing Foundation Formula funding to approved district-wide early education programs.

For a school district to count early education children as one-half (0.5) of a full-time equivalent student, DEED must approve its early education program. School districts will:

- Consult with all local and tribal Head Start programs within the district service area;
- Implement the Alaska Early Education Program Standards;
- Submit an application for Early Education Program Approval and 0.5 ADM Funding by May 15; and,
- Receive approval from the Department of Education and Early Development by September 1.

There are instances when four- and five-year-old students cannot be counted in a district's average daily membership (ADM) that determines Foundation Formula funding. Students that are enrolled in early education programs that receive state and/or federal funding specifically for pre-kindergarten programs are not eligible to be counted in a district's ADM. See the table below. For example, the Early Education Program Grant and the State Pre-Elementary Grant have one purpose, to improve early education, thus students attending these programs cannot be counted in a district's ADM.

On the other hand, funding sources that have multiple purposes, not solely for pre-kindergarten programs, can supplement Foundation Formula funding. For example, Title I, Part A funds and Comprehensive Literacy State Development Program Grants (CLSD) can be used for a variety of purposes across PreK-12 education. Since these funds are not provided specifically for early education programs, students who are four- and five-years old and attending programs funded by these sources can be counted in a district's ADM.
