

## **QUICK GUIDE TO STATEWIDE ASSESSMENTS**

According to Alaska Regulations <u>4 AAC 06.710</u> and <u>4 AAC 06.712</u>, public schools in Alaska must administer the following assessments: a standards-based test, an alternate assessment, the National Assessment of Educational Progress, a kindergarten developmental profile, an assessment to measure English language proficiency, and a statewide screening tool for literacy.
