- SP Code "L": Eligible migratory children who received a book and participated in a related literacy instruction/activity led by a **migrant funded certified teacher** (if the teacher was not migrant funded, please use code A).

**Note:** You do not need to report both SP Codes "A" and "L" for an individual child. If a child received a book and participated in a literacy instruction/activity led by a migrant funded certified teacher, you would only claim SP Code "L".
