DEED Announces Alaska Agencies Providing Free Meals to Children

JUNEAU -- The Department of Education & Early Development (DEED), Child Nutrition Programs, announces the participation of <u>Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) agencies</u> in Alaska providing meals free of charge to enrolled children without regard to race, color, national origin, sex, age, or disability.

These non-profit, for-profit, or governmental agencies include child care centers, adult day care centers, Head Start programs, emergency shelters, at-risk afterschool and outside school hour care centers, and family day care home providers. These agencies receive funds from the U.S. Department of Agriculture's (USDA) CACFP. DEED's Child Nutrition Programs staff oversee all aspects of this program.

In accordance with federal civil rights law and USDA civil rights regulations and policies, the USDA, its agencies, offices, and employees, and institutions participating in or administering USDA programs are prohibited from discriminating based on race, color, national origin, sex, disability, age, or reprisal or retaliation for prior civil rights activity in any program or activity conducted or funded by USDA.

Persons with disabilities who require alternative means of communication for program information (e.g. Braille, large print, audiotape, American Sign Language, etc.), should contact the agency (State or local) where they applied for benefits. Individuals who are deaf, hard of hearing, or have speech disabilities may contact USDA through the Federal Relay Service at (800) 877-8339. Additionally, program information may be made available in languages other than English.
