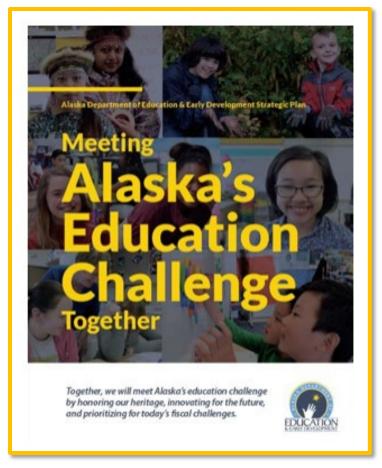




## Our Strategic Priorities: Alaska's Education Challenge

## The State's Role

- DEED provides information, resources and leadership in the area of school improvement
  - Make allocations
  - Review, help refine, and approve plans and budget
  - Provide professional development
  - Monitor, identify, and scale effective initiatives to improve student achievement across Alaska's schools.



## 2022-23 S.Y. School Improvement Process

- > Money allocated July 1 for current list of designated schools
- > GMS becomes one-stop shop for school improvement
  - 1003a budget, application, and Title I plan
- > AK STEPP retired June 30, 2022
- > Cohort 1 pilots new process for school improvement
  - Develop a three-year plan with Empowerment Specialist support
- > All other designated schools submit a condensed 1003(a) grant application



## The 2022-23 S.Y. Condensed Application

(Non-Cohort 1 Schools)

- For the 2022-23 S.Y., all non-Cohort 1 schools will submit a condensed application for 1003(a) school improvement grants.
  - The condensed application will be used for FY23
- Non-Cohort 1 schools will begin developing their three-year plan during the 2022-23 school year
- The first step in developing a three-year plan is to increase diverse representation on the school and community leadership team.



# TRANSITION PROCESS

For all currently designated CSI/TSI schools <u>except</u>
Cohort 1 schools

- Condensed application and budget loaded to GMS by May 1, 2022
- School Year 2022-2023 will become a planning year for the development of a three-year plan
- A series of webinars and Office Hours will be provided in 2022-23 to explicate the 4-step *Playbook* process.



# TRANSITION PROCESS CONTINUED

Things to consider and plan for...

- All "newly" designated schools will receive a planning grant after the accountability system is run in the fall
- With new designations, schools will move into 3-year planning process
- To develop a plan following this process will require at least six School and Community Leadership Team meetings
- Need to have your team ready to go!
- May need to consider scheduling in time (Jan – Apr) to make this happen
