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<p>AMP Computer-Based Assessment (CBA) ELA, Math, Science*</p>	<p>Gr 3-10</p>	<p>Measures students' mastery of the Alaska ELA, Math and Science Standards. *Science tested in grades 4,8,10 only.</p>
<p>AMP Paper-Based Assessment** ELA, Math, Science*</p>	<p>Gr 3-10</p>	<p>Measures students' mastery of the Alaska ELA, Math and Science Standards. The paper-based assessment is available to school with a waiver from computer-based assessment and to students who need a paper-based accommodation. Paper-based accommodation assessments may be administered during the main AMP window. Paper-based school assessments have a limited window (March 29-April 8). *Science tested in grades 4,8,10 only. **NOTE: Only for schools who have an approved waiver from computer-based Assessments.</p>
<p>ACCESS 2.0</p>	<p>Gr K-12</p>	<p>Measures the English language proficiency of students who are identified as English language learners (ELLs) or Limited English Proficiency (LEP) students.</p>
<p>DLM Alternate Assessment; Science Alternate Assessment</p>	<p>Gr 3-10</p>	<p>Students with significant cognitive disabilities who are on a track to receive a certificate of achievement will take this assessment</p>
<p>College and Career Readiness Assessments</p> <p align="center">SAT</p> <p align="center">ACT</p> <p align="center">WorkKeys</p>	<p>Grade 11</p>	<p>Measures students' readiness for college entry or career. Required for grade 11 students; available to grade 12 students who have not previously taken the assessment. Districts are required to administer one or both college-readiness assessments (ACT, SAT) and the career-readiness assessment (WorkKeys). Students choose either a college readiness assessment <u>or</u> a career-readiness assessment. Students taking college-readiness assessments may choose to include writing. Students taking the career-readiness assessment must take all three subtests: Applied Mathematics, Reading for Information, and Locating Information.</p>
<p>Developmental Profile</p>	<p>Gr K or 1</p>	<p>This assessment indicates: the student's physical health; social and emotional development; approaches to learning; cognition and general knowledge; communication, language, and literacy; and the student's background.</p>
<p>Early Literacy Screener</p>	<p>Gr K-2; 3</p>	<p>This assessment must be given at least once during each school year .Third-grade students take this assessment if they are identified as experiencing delays in attaining early literacy skills.</p>
