









QUICK GUIDE TO STATEWIDE ASSESSMENTS

According to Alaska Regulations [4 AAC 06.710](#) and [4 AAC 06.712](#), public schools in Alaska must administer the following assessments: a standards-based test, an alternate assessment, the National Assessment of Educational Progress, a kindergarten developmental profile, and an assessment to measure English language proficiency. As part of the Alaska Reads Act, [14.30.760 of HB 114](#), it is described that the department shall adopt a statewide screening tool.
