• COVID-19 Child Nutrition Response #39– Nationwide Waiver of Onsite Monitoring Requirements for Sponsors in the Child Nutrition Programs

FNS waives, for all sponsoring organizations that elect to be subject to this waiver, that reviews conducted pursuant to regulations at 226.16(d)(4)(iii) be conducted onsite. This waiver allows for offsite monitoring in addition to the flexibilities provided for sponsors in the extension of <u>COVID-19 Child Nutrition</u> <u>Response #27</u>: Nationwide Waiver of Monitoring Requirements for Sponsors in the Child and Adult Care Food Program, issued June 8, 2020 and effective through August 31, 2020. This waiver is effective immediately, and remains in effect through September 30, 2021.

Sponsors must submit a waiver request to Ann-Marie Martin, CACFP Coordinator, in order to take advantage of this waiver after August 31, 2020.

• CACFP Sponsor Monitoring Waiver

Alaska Child Nutrition Programs has been authorized by USDA Food Nutrition Services (FNS) to provide a waiver for onsite monitoring requirements under program regulations contained at 7 CFR 226.16(d)(4)(iii). This waiver also allows for offsite monitoring.

Waiver request posted on the FY2021 CNP Database Checklist tab. Upload to CNP if starting October 1st or after – otherwise send via e-mail to Ann-Marie Martin and/or Jennifer Cherian at DEED. If you had an approved waiver in the past it expires August 31st so a new waiver must be received by September 1st.

CACFP Meal Pattern Flexibility Waiver

Alaska Child Nutrition Programs has been authorized to provide waivers for CACFP Sponsors to allow for meal pattern flexibility during the COVID-19. The State Agency will consider requests that are targeted and justified based upon disruptions to the availability of food products resulting from unprecedented impacts of COVID-19. Program operators are strongly encouraged to maintain and meet the nutrition standards for each Program to the greatest extent possible. Program operators electing to utilize this waiver must identify the food component(s) they are not able to meet and provide a justification why the meal pattern cannot be met. As a reminder, Federal procurement regulations at 2 CFR 200.320(f) allow procurement by noncompetitive proposals when there is a public emergency. This is a waiver of federal regulation 7 CFR 226.20.

Waiver request posted on the FY2021 CNP Database Checklist tab. Upload to CNP if starting October 1st or after – otherwise send via e-mail to Ann-Marie Martin and/or Jennifer Cherian at DEED. If you had an approved waiver in the past it expired July 31st so a new waiver must be received by September 1st.

• CACFP Non-Congregate Feeding Waiver

Alaska Child Nutrition Programs has been authorized to provide waivers for CACFP sponsors **for noncongregate feeding for enrolled students (and eligible participants for At-Risk/OSHC)** for program flexibility to support access to nutritious meals while minimizing potential exposure to the novel coronavirus (COVID-19). To qualify for this wavier Sponsors/Institutions must develop meal distribution methods to ensure accountability and integrity. Procedures must be submitted with the waiver. This would include attendance and meal count recordkeeping. Meal distribution methods may vary by community risk levels. This is a waiver of federal regulation 7 CFR 226.19(b)(6)(iii): Maintain children on-site while meals are consumed.

Alaska Child Nutrition Programs has been authorized to provide waivers for CACFP sponsors for **meal service time flexibility**, this waiver allows CACFP sponsors the flexibility to align meal service times as necessary. Under Program regulations at 7 CFR 226.20(k), Child Nutrition Programs meals must follow meal service time requirements. However, FNS recognizes that for school year 2020-2021, waiving the meal service time requirements will support safer access to nutritious meals.

Alaska Child Nutrition Programs has been authorized to provide a waiver for CACFP sponsors to **distribute meals to a parent or guardian for their enrolled children**. Sponsors will need to notify the State of their plan to maintain accountability and program integrity, which includes tracking system to ensure only meals provided for children (or adult participants if sponsor of Adult Care). This is a waiver of federal regulation 7 CFR 226.2 (Meals).

Waiver request posted on the FY2021 CNP Database Checklist tab. Upload to CNP if starting October 1st or after – otherwise send via e-mail to Ann-Marie Martin and/or Jennifer Cherian at DEED. If you had an approved waiver in the past it expires August 31st so a new waiver must be received by September 1st.

There are five additional questions located on the CNP Database Checklist Tab that need to be answered and uploaded this year. Each agency will answer the questions and attach their policy and procedures (P&P) with the page number where your agency addresses the issue that is posed in each question.
